Guided by its aims and objectives, the Society has established four educational institutions that provide a continuous pathway of education, beginning at the pre-primary level and extending to undergraduate education in the field of Arts.

Background of the Union Education Society

With the vision of providing formal and quality education to the minority community in Solapur, the late **Mr. Abdul Karim Bawalal Vakil**, a distinguished advocate, social reformer, and visionary leader, founded the **Union Education Society, Solapur**, in **1944**. Driven by a deep commitment to educational and social advancement, Mr. Vakil, along with a group of dedicated philanthropists and community leaders, worked tirelessly to establish an institution that would create opportunities for learning and empowerment. They contributed their time, resources, expertise, and unwavering dedication to laying a strong foundation for the Society.

Over the decades, the Union Education Society has evolved into one of the region's most respected educational organizations, offering quality education across multiple levels—from kindergarten to higher education. Guided by its founding principles of academic excellence, inclusivity, and social responsibility, the Society has consistently expanded its educational initiatives to meet the changing needs of the community. Today, the Union Education Society continues to uphold its legacy of excellence by nurturing generations of students through accessible, value-based, and holistic education. This is the only Mahila Mahavidyalaya in the vicinity of the Punyashlok Ahilyadevi Holkar Solapur University, Solapur, having its centre for teaching the Urdu subject at the graduation level. Guidelines for Admission

Candidates seeking admission to **Union Education Society's Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Solapur** are advised to read the following guidelines carefully. Admission to all programmes shall be governed by the rules and regulations of **NEP 2020, Punyashlok Ahilyadevi Holkar Solapur University**, the Government of Maharashtra, and the College.

Admission Procedure

1. Admissions shall be granted strictly based on eligibility, merit, reservation policy, and the norms prescribed by the University and Government.
2. Admission is provisional and subject to verification of original documents and approval by the Principal and the University.
3. Students are advised to consult the Admission Committee for guidance regarding the selection of Major, Minor, Multidisciplinary, Skill Enhancement, and Value Added Courses under **NEP 2020**.
4. Admission shall be confirmed only after payment of the prescribed fees within the stipulated time.
5. Submission of incorrect information or forged documents will result in cancellation of admission without prior notice.

Documents Required

Applicants shall submit the following documents (originals with photocopies) at the time of admission:

- SSC (Class X) Mark Sheet
- HSC (Class XII) Mark Sheet

- Transfer Certificate (TC)/School Leaving Certificate
- Migration Certificate (if applicable)
- Caste Certificate and Validity Certificate (where applicable)
- Non-Creamy Layer Certificate (where applicable)
- Income Certificate (for scholarship applicants)
- Aadhaar Card
- Passport-size photographs
- Any other documents prescribed by the University or Government.

Attendance and Academic Requirements

1. Students must maintain a minimum of **75% attendance** in each course as prescribed by the University.
2. Students failing to meet the minimum attendance requirement may not be permitted to appear for the University examinations unless otherwise permitted under University rules.
3. Continuous Internal Assessment, assignments, seminars, projects, fieldwork, and OJT, other academic activities are mandatory wherever applicable under **NEP 2020**.

NEP 2020 Academic Guidelines

1. Students shall choose their **Major, Minor, Multidisciplinary Courses, Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Value Education Courses (VEC/VSC)**, and other curriculum components as per the NEP 2020 framework.
2. Students are expected to participate in **Community Engagement Programmes (CEP), Field Projects (FP), On-the-Job Training (OJT)**, and other experiential learning activities wherever applicable.
3. Academic credits earned shall be governed by the **Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)** and University regulations.
4. Students are encouraged to participate in research, innovation, skill development, environmental awareness, and community outreach activities.

General Rules

1. Students shall maintain discipline, punctuality, and proper conduct within the College campus.

2. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited and is punishable under the provisions of the **UGC Anti-Ragging Regulations** and applicable laws.
3. Students shall wear their College Identity Card while on campus.
4. Damage to College property or misconduct may invite disciplinary action.
5. Students must regularly check the College Notice Board, website, and official communication channels for important announcements.
6. Any change in address, contact number, or other personal information must be immediately communicated to the College Office.
7. If a student remains absent continuously without prior permission or valid reason, the College reserves the right to cancel her admission in accordance with University rules after due notice.

RULES OF DISCIPLINE

1. Students shall maintain regularity and punctuality in attending classes, tutorials, practicals, seminars, and other academic activities. Attendance shall be governed by the norms prescribed by the University and Government from time to time.
2. Students must maintain satisfactory academic progress and actively participate in curricular, co-curricular, and extracurricular activities as encouraged under NEP 2020.
3. Ragging in any form, either within or outside the college campus, is strictly prohibited. Any violation will invite disciplinary action as per the UGC Anti-Ragging Regulations and Government rules.
4. Students shall maintain discipline, dignity, and mutual respect towards fellow students, teaching staff, non-teaching staff, and visitors.
5. Students shall refrain from activities that disturb the academic environment or violate the laws of the country. Misconduct may result in disciplinary action, including suspension or expulsion.
6. Students must carry their valid College Identity Card at all times while on campus and produce it whenever required by the college authorities.
7. Students should regularly check the college notice board, official website, and digital communication platforms for important announcements. Ignorance of notified information will not be accepted as a valid excuse.
8. Any address change, mobile number, email ID, or other personal details must be communicated promptly to the college office.
9. Students are responsible for maintaining cleanliness and protecting college property. Any damage to furniture, laboratory equipment, library books, classrooms, or other institutional property shall be recovered from the concerned student(s).

10. Vehicles should be parked only in the designated parking areas. The college will not be responsible for loss or damage to vehicles or personal belongings.
11. Students are expected to participate in national celebrations, institutional programmes, community outreach activities, NSS/NCC activities (where applicable), and other events organized by the college.
12. Mobile phones and electronic devices should be used responsibly. Their use during lectures, examinations, or other academic sessions is prohibited unless permitted for academic purposes.
13. Students shall follow the prescribed dress code/uniform, wherever applicable, and maintain decent attire and proper conduct on campus.
14. Writing on walls, desks, furniture, or defacing college property in any manner is strictly prohibited.
15. Students shall observe academic integrity. Any form of plagiarism, cheating, impersonation, or examination malpractice will be dealt with according to University and UGC regulations.
16. Students are expected to uphold the values of equality, inclusiveness, gender sensitivity, and respect for diversity, in accordance with the principles of NEP 2020.
17. Students shall use library, laboratory, sports, and ICT facilities responsibly and follow the respective rules governing their use.
18. The college reserves the right to frame, amend, or enforce additional rules and regulations whenever necessary in the interest of discipline and academic excellence.
19. Any student found violating the above rules shall be liable for disciplinary action as per the rules of the College, University, UGC, and Government.

3. Students should carefully complete and submit all required application forms, examination forms, scholarship applications, and other documents within the prescribed deadlines. The College shall not be responsible for any loss arising from delay, negligence, or incorrect submission.

4. Students are expected to maintain cleanliness and help preserve a healthy, hygienic, plastic-free, and eco-friendly campus environment.

GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIPS

The college facilitates eligible students in applying for scholarships and fee concessions offered by the central government, state government, university, and other recognised agencies. Students are advised to submit scholarship applications and all required documents within the prescribed deadlines.

1. **Rajarshi Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj Scholarship (EBC)** – Available to eligible students belonging to the Economically Backward Class (EBC), subject to the income limit and other eligibility criteria prescribed by the Government of Maharashtra.
2. **Open Merit Scholarship and Freeship** – Awarded to meritorious and deserving students in accordance with government and university regulations.

3. Scholarships for Students with Disabilities (Divyangjan)—Financial assistance is available for eligible students with benchmark disabilities, subject to submission of the required disability certificate and other prescribed documents.
4. Labour Welfare Scholarship – Children of registered workers, including beedi workers, construction workers, and other eligible labour categories, may avail scholarships offered by the Maharashtra Labour Welfare Board and other Government agencies.
5. Minority Scholarships – Eligible students from minority communities may apply for scholarships notified by the Government from time to time.

Salient Features of the College

The college is dedicated to delivering high-quality education in a secure, inclusive, and studentfriendly atmosphere. Located in the heart of the city, the institution offers easy accessibility and a secure campus exclusively for girls. It nurtures students from diverse social, cultural, and economic backgrounds while promoting equality, discipline, and mutual respect.

The institution places strong emphasis on the holistic development of every student by fostering intellectual growth, ethical values, leadership qualities, creativity, and social responsibility. Through learner-centric teaching, mentoring, and co-curricular engagement, the college strives to develop confident, competent, and socially responsible graduates.

Evaluation System

To ensure continuous academic progress and learning outcomes, the college follows a comprehensive evaluation system comprising: Internal Assessment Tests, Unit Tests, Tutorials, Assignments, Seminars and Presentations, Project Work, and Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

Regular feedback is provided to students to support academic improvement and enhance learning.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The **Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)** plays a pivotal role in promoting quality culture and continuous improvement in the institution. It plans, monitors, and reviews academic and administrative activities to ensure effective implementation of quality enhancement initiatives. The IQAC regularly coordinates with various statutory and non-statutory committees, monitors

their functioning, and ensures that their activities are carried out efficiently in accordance with the guidelines of the University, UGC, NAAC, and NEP 2020.

The Cell organises quality enhancement programmes, including workshops, seminars, faculty development programmes, and awareness sessions. It encourages the adoption of innovative teaching-learning practices, ICT-enabled education, research, extension activities, and best practices. Through periodic reviews, documentation, feedback analysis, and academic audits, the IQAC strives to enhance institutional performance and foster a culture of excellence and continuous quality improvement.

Physical Education and Sports

The college believes that physical fitness is an essential component of holistic education. A well-equipped Gymkhana and sports facilities provide opportunities for students to participate in indoor and outdoor games in a safe and encouraging environment.

Under the guidance of a qualified director of physical education, students actively participate in Inter-Collegiate, University, State, and National-level competitions. Facilities and training are available for games such as: Athletics, Table Tennis, Badminton, Chess, Carrom, Volleyball, and other indoor and outdoor sports

Sports kits, tracksuits, shoes, and other necessary equipment are provided to eligible participants.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

The NSS unit organized a wide range of activities, including the observance of important national and international days, awareness campaigns, rallies, guest lectures, cleanliness drives, competitions, the **Har Ghar Tiranga** and **Nasha Mukh Bharat Abhiyan** initiatives, and a seven-day Special Residential Camp to promote community service, environmental awareness, leadership, and civic responsibility.

NEP 2020 Committee

The **NEP 2020 Committee** is constituted to facilitate the effective implementation of the **National Education Policy (NEP) 2020** in accordance with the guidelines issued by the University, UGC, and the Government.

The Committee undertakes the following activities:

Competitive Exam and Career Guidance Committee:

The Career Guidance Committee of the college works to support students in making informed decisions about their academic and professional futures. It organises career counselling sessions, workshops, and seminars to create awareness about higher studies, competitive exams, and employment opportunities. These activities help students develop career clarity, skills, and confidence for life after graduation.

A guest lecture on MPSC/UPSC was organised to guide students in preparing for various competitive examinations. Additionally, an awareness program on MBA, MBT-IT, and MBAHRD was conducted to orient students toward diverse career opportunities in the field of business administration.

Cultural Committee

The Cultural Committee provides a platform for students to showcase their talents, enhance creativity, and build confidence through various cultural and co-curricular activities. Every year, it organizes guest lectures, celebrations of important days, **Talent Hunt Week**, and various competitions. The college has proudly secured awards in the Group Song and Qawwali competitions at the PAHSUS Youth Festival for two consecutive years, reflecting the students' exceptional cultural talent.

Internal Complaints Committee (ICC)
